

# **Home Learning Guide**

To help you get the most out of your eAWARE subscription we have created the following guide to allow you to begin using the eAWARE programme as a distance learning tool.

This guide is also available to download as a PDF from the Assessment guides section of the Teacher dashboard.

The below infographic gives you everything you need to know to get started but we have also enclosed a more detailed guide.

### Step 1

Log into your teacher dashboard and create a child assessment and if desired a parent assessment. Please ensure the date and times are suitable for your requirements.

Remember by default all assessments start at 9:00am and are available till 3:30pm Monday to Sunday.

### Step 2

Send all parents and students the unique code asking them to enter this in the pupil assesment section of www.schools.eaware.co.uk to complete the assessment.

We've created an email template for you to send to parents explaining how to do this. See our detailed guide below.

## Step 4


Download classroom worksheets and email these to students for completion.


Advise the pupils to use the same code to enter the Learning Pathways section on www.schools.eaware.co.uk to watch the learning pathway videos

#### Step 1

To change the default availability of an assessment follow the shown in the capture below:



You can now change the availability of an assessment to be only of specific days and only live at certain times. When editing times please ensure you format the times with a colon. For example, 8am being 08:00.

Please remember that if you are creating a parent and child assessment these will both have unique codes.

We've created an email template for you to send to parents explaining how to do this. This can be found at the end of the document.




#### Step 3

If you would like your students to review the education video-based learning resources at home with their parents they can enter the same child assessment code in the blue box to access the key stage relevant material. Please see below:




Sign in to eAWARE using the code you have been provided with.




### Step 4

During these challenging times as part of our commitment to teaching online safety this academic year we are working with eAWARE.


eAWARE is an online safety programme designed by educational psychologists, teachers and child protection experts covering online safety topics in a fun and creative way.
